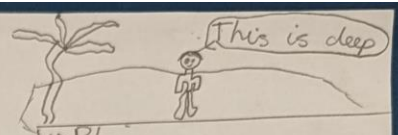
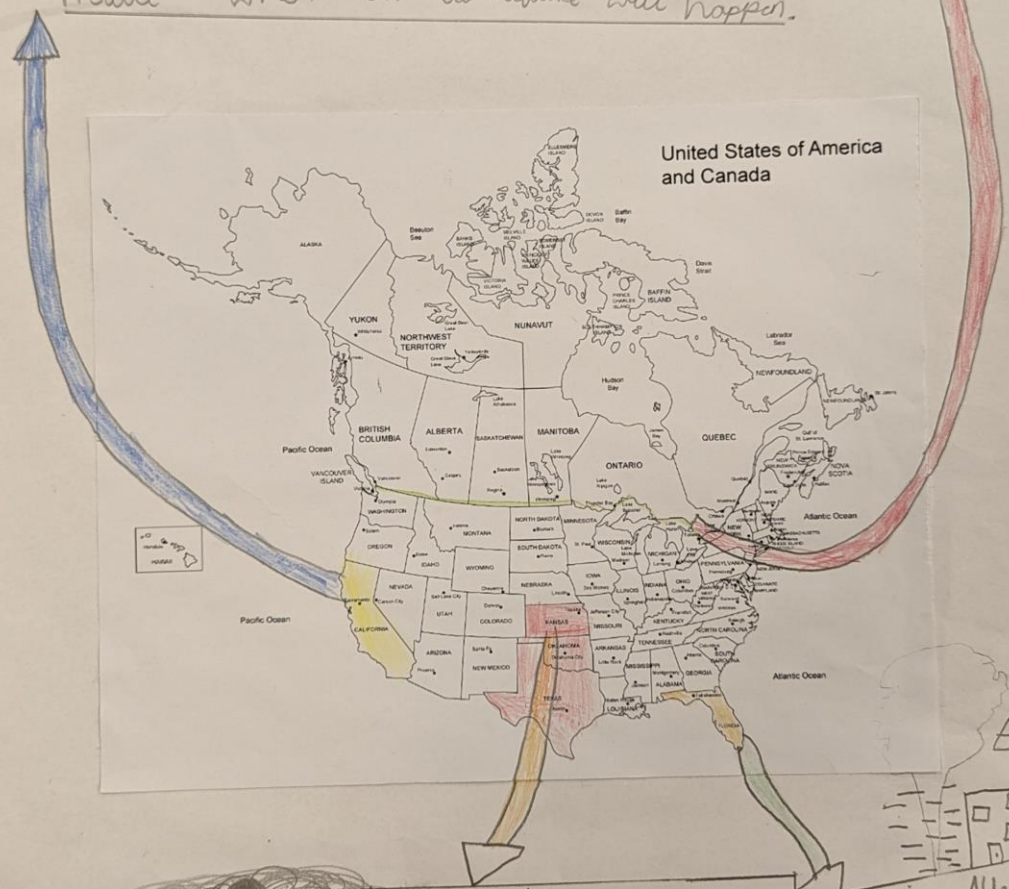




- 1) Earthquake

Tornadoes

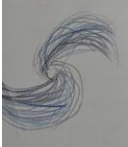
- Tornadoes are most common in Missouri, Oklahoma, South Dakota and Nebraska.

- Tornadoes killed 57,000 people in the United States because of the region's proximity to bad weather.

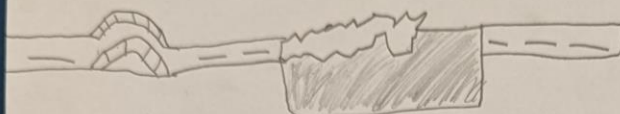

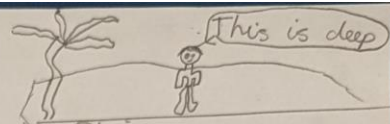
Hurricane

- The last hurricane was in 2023. It's called Hurricane Idalia.

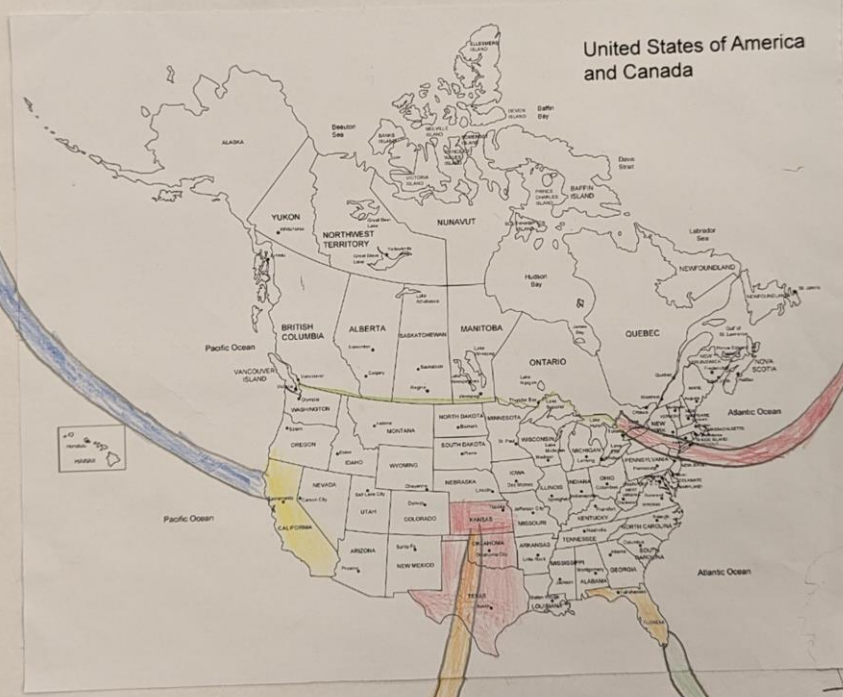




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
